
). The effort put into this project is commendable, as it not only showcases their understanding but also highlights their commitment to keeping themselves and others safe in the virtual realm.

UPEI Explorer Challenge

On Saturday 12th November five TBS students from Year 11 and 12 attended and competed in the UPEI Explorer Challenge. The event took place at the University of Prince Edward Island Cairo Campus in the New Capital against 24 other schools, for a 10,000 LE prize. The Explorer Challenge consisted of problem-solving, critical thinking and reasoning for Mathematics, Sustainable Design and Engineering activities. The activities consisted of a one-minute pitch to market products, inclusive of a TikTok video, manufacturing decisions, implementing logic circuits for computers, cracking morse code, a physical activity in Golds Gym and so many more!

Luckily TBS students were in safe hands with Deepesh Ra (Year 11), who fast tracked 8 IGCSEs in year 10, and Eyad Ali (Year 11) an A level Mathematics student. Some of our student leadership team were also involved with Abdullah Mandil Head Boy and A2 Sciences and Mathematic student; Omar Abbas, Deputy Head Boy and A2 Mathematics and Economics student and Omar Khan, Deputy Head Boy and A2 Physics and Business Studies student.

TBS came first and won the competition overall, with Abdullah Mandil winning the tie breaker with a problem-solving escape puzzle, in a dramatic conclusion to the day! I was thoroughly pleased with our TBS students ´ attitude and willingness to place A level subject knowledge to different problem-solving contexts, and they really did TBS proud on the day.
