Focus on Primary



English Department

Welcome to a new and exciting English and Humanities department at TBS! This term we have a new Head of Department, Ms. Hanan, joining from an Ofsted 'Outstanding' London School. Joining Ms. Lenka in the team we also have Ms. Maryam and Ms. Christina combining their relative experience with KS3 and KS4 across a range of prestigious international schools. Global Perspectives is led by Ms. Farah, who is supporting students with their development of global citizenship, research skills and engaging in real world issues. Together the team is really looking forward to boosting excitement and engagement for all TBS students in the English department.

The department is celebrating some fantastic grades from last academic year including: -53% of the GCSE cohort achieved a grade 7-9 in English Language -72% achieved a grade 4-7 in English as a Second Language -100% of the cohort achieved a grade 4-9 in English Literature iGCSE -In year 9, 100% of the cohort passed their pre-IGCSE exam

Not only is the department running our IGCSE courses, but we are also offering support for students preparing for their IELTS assessments in order to study at British universities, as well as supporting a range of A Level studies in both English Language and Literature. The department had impressive grades last academic year at both A2 and IGCSE in May/June exams:

- ·AS Economics 50% of students achieved A-A*
- ·A2 Business Studies (A*C) 75%
- ·AS Business Studies (A-C) 71%
- ·IG Accounting 9-4 (A*-C) 60%
- ·IG Economics 9-7 (A*-C) 55%
- ·IGCSE Business Studies 9-4 (A*- C) 77%
- •Travel and Tourism 9-4 (A*-C) 58%



The results are a testament to our team last academic year and our students 'dedication. To help students at home please have open discussions on current business stories in the media. For example, most recently the distribution channels in Ukraine reopening, using ships with Egyptian crew members W. Bringing content into context is a fundamental ingredient to our students' success.
