Colours of Spring around New Cairo

You might have noticed the new paler leaf growth on the trees in the central reservation of the road at Gate 1. This is a rather unusual tree, not for it's flowers which are spiky white balls but for it's seed pods. Monkey (or Elephant) Ear Tree (Enterolobium cyclocarpum) is native to the tropical regions of the Americas, from central Mexico south to northern Brazil. It is prized for its shady canopy as well as it's curiously shaped seedpods. It is the national tree of Costa Rica.

Below the leafy canopy of the Monkey Ear Trees grow two plants: the Golden Daisy Bush and the Golden Dewdrop bush. The Golden Daisy Bush (euryops pecinatus), native to South Africa is a favourite of bees and makes a lovely carpet with it's yellow star shaped flowers and gray-green leaves. Alongside the Golden Daisy Bush is the Golden Dewdrop bush (duranta erecta), native to tropical America which also attracts pollinators and birds with it's flowers and berries. It is the variegated form that is planted outside school.

English Department

Key Stage 3 have been working towards developing written answers using a style of writing that enables them to explain and give reason as to why something is the way it is. For instance, in texts students are often asked to explain the reason why the writer has used specifical language. The answer might be to create mood, or to create suspense for instance. Students are then required to extend their answers further through giving evidence from the text that they have read. Ms. Liz wanted to bring the style of writing to life through exploring art. The students have created some beautiful artwork led by Ms. Karmen in the art department, displaying creative portraits using a range of deep colors and perspectives. Ms. Liz asked the students to identify a piece of artwork that captured their eye, and write a P.E.E paragraph to explain how and why the piece inspired and appealed to them. Please ask your son/daughter to explain to you what P.E.E is. The opportunity for them to explain it to you is also a learning moment too.

Dress Code Reminder

Every morning as your children enter school we monitor their uniform to ensure that they are in keeping with our TBS Dress Code. Thank you for your support with keeping jewellery at home and for taking note in regards to facial piercing.
