# Here's to an exciting year in Year 1!

Year One has been learning about Queen Elizabeth II. We went on a word hunt and created mind maps with all the fun facts we learnt about her. We have also been learning to identify nouns and writing the names of people, pets and places with capital letters. We have been introduced to the part-whole model where we can split one whole number into two parts. We've had so much fun using the part-whole models to write number sentence and add the two parts together.





# What do you think of our Art? Don't you think they all look fantastic!

Year 3 have been working extremely hard and have produced many fantastic pieces of work this term across all their subject. In Thematic this term, we have continued learning all about the prehistoric monument Stonehenge. Did you know, Stonehenge is one of the most iconic sites in the world, but also still one of the most mysterious? As part of our art lessons, we decided to recreate Stonehenge. First, we practiced sketching Stonehenge using shade and tone. Then, for our final piece of work we created a sky background with a silhouette of Stonehenge on top. For the sky background, we used pastels in different shades of blue or orange depending on whether the students chose to recreate a sunrise or sunset - we blended the colors with our fingers. For the silhouette, we drew Stonehenge on black card, cut it out and stuck it on top. The students tried really hard to draw each stone carefully. Interestingly, the largest stone, the Heel Stone, weighs about 30 tons.

# What have year four been up to?

This half term... In Literacy, we have been delving into some fantastic readings on "Invaders & Settlers." Students have learned about the Vikings, including who they were, where they originated, and how they invaded Britain. Our pupils' 'The Saga of Biorn'-related writings have been inspired by all this effort. In preparation for the walking museum, we have designed and constructed our own Viking longboats, shields, and swords. In mathematics, we have been practising addition and subtraction with several exchanges and gaining a knowledge of the numerical value of numbers. We have been practising skills with a variety of manipulatives as well as iPads. In addition, we have been examining what makes us unique and expressing our pride in ourselves.





# **News from the Mathematics Department**

Last week, our maths teacher Ms Ghada represented the school at a Cambridge International Assessments training event in Alexandria. As most of our school community will be aware, we are moving towards Cambridge qualifications at IGCSE, AS and A Level.

The aims of the course were to review the syllabus requirements, explore teaching strategies and understand the assessment process. The latter is extremely important to us as there will be significant changes to the assessments from 2025, with the introduction of a non-calculator examination paper for example

The course also explored changes to the syllabus, how to assess how learners are progressing, provoking thinking and including stretch and challenge in lessons.

Our current year 7 and 8 schemes of learning are designed with the aim of preparing our students for Cambridge examinations. Our students begin studying for IGCSE Mathematics in year 9, and we are confident that in the years before their IGCSE studies begin they will have seen and worked with all the skills and knowledge they need to make a successful start to the IGCSE course.



# An update from Mr Nigel Wilsonlock, Head of Secondary

It has been a strange week, especially Tuesday, where the solar eclipse alongside the flooding allowed us to put our health and safety practices into place. Whenever we have a situation that presents a risk to students and staff, we run a risk assessment. This is a standard practice that looks at the severity of the risk and the likelihood of it happening. This then allows us to plan our actions. When the power cuts out, we always check the water pumps so that the fire hydrants and toilets still work! The issue was then about getting students home despite the possible flooding to roads. We couldn't just send all students home early, because not every child would have someone at home to care for them. We therefore arranged for the buses to go slightly earlier with the aim of missing the worst of the traffic. We were happy with the outcomes but know that we need more slip hazard signs to warn people of slippery wet surfaces. I hope your Tuesday ended safely.

The 2022 United Nations Climate Change Conference, more commonly referred to as COP27 will be held in Sharm El Sheikh, November 6-18. We will also be taking part and have two students representing us at the Little COP27 event. The following week we will take part in an international school COP27 symposium with ten students from Y9/10. Climate change is very important to all of us and I am looking forward to hearing from students about what they would like us to do.

This weekend I will be off shopping to get some more pink items and support out students' Think Pink' event on Monday, 31 October. Their target is to beat last years' 23,000LE and aim for 30,000LE. Student Leaders have collaborated with Primary students so I am quietly confident they will reach their goal. Please use this as an area of conversation with your children, help them build both their vocabulary and understanding.

Finally, I am looking forward to seeing many of you in school at our Student Led Conferences on Sunday and Monday 30/31 October. Please note that these are with the tutor only and are focused on your child settling-in and their well-being. I look forward to seeing you support 'Think Pink' too!
